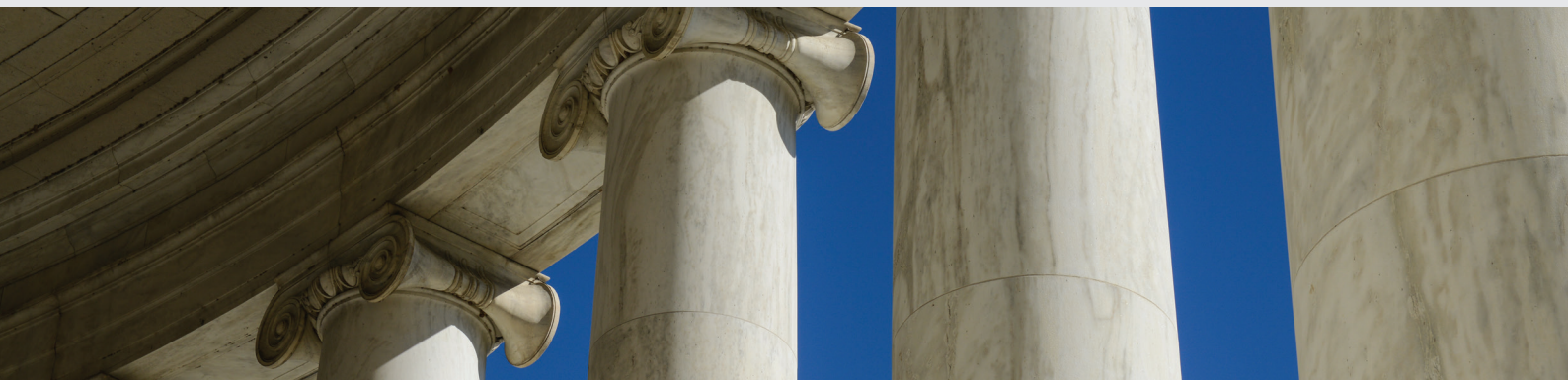

Case Study Government

AQSIQ

A group of Chinese inspectors from the General Administration of Quality Supervision, Inspection and Quarantine (AQSIQ) visited the UK for a final compliance visit before concluding a UK-China barley trade agreement. During their visit, British counterparts from the Agriculture and Horticulture Development Board (AHDB) and industry representatives demonstrated how farming practices, assurance schemes and phytosanitary processes, within a complex legislative framework, ensure that food safety and the quality of barley is maintained throughout the supply chain. This job was both physically and intellectually challenging for the interpreter. The nine-day assignment involved lots of travelling and fieldwork across the UK, and covered a wide range of barley-related topics, including weeds, barley diseases and pests.
